The meeting was called to order at 7:05 am.

Leann Peterson moved to accept the minutes from the September meeting; Cheryl Benson seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous to accept the meetings from the September meeting.

As a follow-up from the September meeting, we had a road and parking lot update. The district has found land in Trenton that will be swapped and designated as a wetland so that we can develop land by the school to finish 3100 North and our parking lot. 3100 North will go east towards 1200 East and 200 West will be finished going into Hyde Park to alleviate traffic concerns before and after school.

Parent Teacher Conferences went well last week. A parent questioned why the school couldn't have had Monday the 1st off instead of Tuesday the 2nd so that the kids could have a 4-day weekend. This wasn't considered because 1-the conferences were originally scheduled for Oct 8th and 9th and were only moved because quite a few teachers were scheduled to be out for a Solutions Tree Conference in SLC and 2-evening conferences work better on Monday to accommodate teacher schedules and avoid conflicts with sports.

The school will be holding an evacuation drill on Thursday, October 11th. We will be on an assembly schedule and all students will be evacuated to Greenville Elementary.

Shane Jones reviewed the CCSD Digital Citizenship plan, which is in place to ensure responsible use of technology in school. Part of the plan is that student use of computer and network in schools is monitored by Go Guardian. Students are all also assigned google accounts to be used at school; these can be monitored as well. There will be a Netsmartz assembly on November 20th to discuss internet safety with students.

We went over data from last years SAGE testing. Green Canyon is ranked in the top 25 high schools in the state, as are all high schools in the district. We also high in ACT scores with students reaching benchmark. This year SAGE will be replaced with ASPIRE PLUS for 9th and 10th graders. This test, which is similar in format to the ACT, will be administered over two days in two hour sections for each grade.

We watched a video entitled Life of Privilege - Race as a reminder of the challenges that students may face. Our goal as a school is to make sure that all students have an opportunity to learn and succeed, no matter what challenges that they face outside of school.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 am.
