Steve B. welcomed and call the meeting to order at 7:05 a.m.

Randy B. moved to accept the minutes from October. Cheryl B. 2nd and Steve B. called for a vote. The minutes were approved.

Mitch P. volunteered to check the GC website to update SCC meeting times.

Dave S. reported that Tim Smith from the district office is working on a package to implement a changes and improvements for digital citizenship.

Terri R. explained the state legislature is starting to draft bills for the new legislative session. The Tax Reform bill is of particular interest for education. This item was tabled until December. The discussion of tax reform legislation will be at the top of the agenda for December.

Steve B. encourage the SCC to think of projects that we could sponsor or participate in to benefit Green Canyon.

Randy B. reported of a sponsor who donates scarves, hats, and gloves for students in need. He asked the members of the school community council to let him know of any students who are in need of these kinds of item. Randy asked if we could come to the December meeting with names of students in our neighborhoods that need help.

Green Canyon Gives Back is scheduled for Monday, May 4, 2020. Dave S. told us they are considering having most of the activities inside the school this year. The SCC will be involved again this year.

Dave S. reported on the PACK Pantry. The pantry contain food items, school supplies, coats/gloves, and hygiene kits. ALL students may ask for items for the pantry. Tax deductible donations to support the PACK Pantry can be made to the Cache Education Foundation (specifically state GC PACK Pantry on your donation).

Dave S. and Max J. reported on the ASPIRE+ testing. This test is a combinations of the ACT and some SAGE test questions. It is new and was given to last year's 9th and 10th graders for the first time. Students and parents can access the test scores in Student Docs on PowerSchool. The student's code is on their form, or they can contact the counseling office.

Shane J. reported on data packages that include attendance, extracurricular, fails, enrollment, graduation information, and student involvement. Mitch P. suggested other items to track might include mental health and visits to the PACK Pantry.

Dave. S. reviewed the calendar of PLTs, Faculty Committees, and Staff Training. There is currently a curriculum map for 75% of the teachers. The long term plan is to have curriculum maps for 100% of the subjects.

Monica E. reported on students passing school buses when the bus has its red stop sign and flashing light engaged. The administration said Mr. Oldham is putting together a safe driving reminder that will be used during announcement.
